Four of the Three Musketeers draws on an unmatched array of sources, many not referenced elsewhere. Bader's detailed portrait of the struggling young actors both brings to vivid life a typical night on the road for the Marx Brothers and also illuminates the inner workings of the vaudeville business, especially during its peak in the 1920s. Four of the Three Musketeers is exactly the kind of biography I really enjoy. Bader did a phenomenal amount of research—to the extent of digging up microfiches of tiny newspapers, long defunct, in the towns performers wound through during the days of vaudeville.
