Robinson Crusoe (/ ˈ ʔ k r u? s o? /) is a novel by Daniel Defoe, first published on 25 April 1719. The first edition credited the work's protagonist Robinson Crusoe as its author, leading many readers to believe he was a real person and the book a travelogue of true incidents. Daniel Defoe's *The Life and Strange Surprising Adventures of Robinson Crusoe* was published as a fictional memoir in 1719. It was so commercially successful that he quickly wrote a sequel. *Robinson Crusoe*, in full *The Life and Strange Surprising Adventures of Robinson Crusoe, of York, Mariner: Who Lived Eight and Twenty Years, All Alone in an Un-inhabited Island on the Coast of America, Near the Mouth of the Great River of Oroonoke; Having Been Cast on Shore by Shipwreck, Wherein All the Men Perished but Himself*. *Robinson Crusoe on Mars* is a 1964 independently made American science fiction film in Technicolor and Techniscope, produced by Aubrey Schenck, directed by Byron Haskin, that stars Paul Mantee, Victor Lundin, and Adam West.
